One of our geographically closest community partners, Byrd Barr place has recently undergone a complete transformation from a Food Bank-style operation to a Market-Style operation! This change in physical format, Tafari explained, allows more diverse choices for shoppers, while also giving them the opportunity to, as he said, "shop with dignity." He also reflected on changing the feel from a mindset of scarcity to one of abundance for their clientele.

He lauded the long partnership with Central Co-op, and particularly the availability of cultural and dietary options that they are able to purchase at the Co-op to offer to their participants.
